



Thornbury Township Walking Trail System

- Several miles of walking trails that are part of or connect Township Parks and Open Space
- These trails are developed and maintained by the Township Environmental Advisory Council (EAC)
- Our trails offer access to scenic venues, historic sites, and watersheds. These trails are used for EAC activities including stream clean ups (with CRC), stream ecology for kids, or birdwalks.





Thornbury Township Historic Sites

- Thornbury Township has a rich history dating back to Pre-Revolutionary War Era. The remains of a number buildings and remnants of the industries that were part of this era are accessible via the trail system. This includes,
 - Frazer Ruins
 - Quarry
 - Stone Mill
 - Stone Loader





Thornbury Township Scenic Vistas and Watershed Access

- Chester Creek runs through the Township. Our trail system allows residents and visitors access to these watersheds
- Wetlands include Barrett's Meadow 29 acres





Conservation

- The EAC in conjunction with volunteers conducts a number of efforts every year to conserve and the environment
 - Annual Stream Clean Up with CRC
 - Trail Clearing
 - Tree Planting
 - Stream Bank Erosion Prevention






Activities
